CENTRAL TENNIS CLUB COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN

Last Updated: April 8, 2021



MEASURES WE ARE TAKING:

1. SCREENING

Passive screening:

- Post signs with self-screening questions and instructions at entrance gates
- Post signs clearly stating that people are not to enter if they have COVID-19 symptoms
- Members on court bookings sign an acknowledgment and assumption of risk of COVID-19, including a self-screen of COVID-19 symptoms
- · Reminders on club website
- Include the "Guidelines: Playing Tennis During COVID-19" on club website and post at club

No guests allowed

2. PHYSICAL DISTANCING

- Physical distancing signs reminding members to keep a minimum of 2 meters or 6 feet apart at gates and on window
 - o Members in the same household not required to social distance
- Control and stagger entry to courts to ensure distancing
- To ensure maximum of 10 players on courts:
 - Court 1 & 3 to be used for singles or doubles
 - o Court 2 to be used for singles only
- Control entry and exit flow; members will enter at the main gate and exit at the gate opposite Court 2, following directional signage
- If the clubhouse opens, install physical distancing markers
- Control number of people (with signage) in clubhouse, if allowed to open
- Leave the court and facilities immediately after you finish playing, no hanging around before or after game
- Arrive close to time of game
- Follow "Guidelines: Playing Tennis During COVID-19" posted on clubhouse window and on website

3. USE OF MASKS AND FACE COVERINGS

- Ask members to arrive with masks, if entering clubhouse (when allowed to open) and exiting
- Post signage of proper face mask usage
- If distance can't be maintained, use a mask
- Post Mask Policy on website

4. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

- Hand sanitizer is available at the club in three locations, using hospital-grade sanitizer that is suitable for outdoor setting
- "Masks Required Indoors" signage is posted on clubhouse window

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5. HAND HYGIENE AND RESPIRATORY ETIQUETTE

- Provide signs on proper hand washing/sanitizing
- Provide alcohol-based (greater than 70% alcohol) hand sanitizers or other medically-approved sanitizer at club
- · Sanitizers are at each gate and outside the clubhouse
- Inform members where the sanitizers are located
- Must be used upon entrance, if equipment or balls are touched, and at exit
- Post signage of covering cough

6. CLEANING AND DISINFECTING

When/if the clubhouse will be open:

- Ensure adequate supply of liquid soap, paper towel, and waste receptacle
- Washroom only to be used when clubhouse is allowed to open
- Ask masked member to hand-sanitize prior to entering the clubhouse (when allowed to open)
- Possibly provide a table with the disinfecting supplies outside the washroom
- Encourage members to maintain a clean facility and dispose of used masks and sanitizing wipes safely

7. VENTILATION AND AIRFLOW

When/if the clubhouse will be open:

- Keep windows and doors open for better cross-ventilation
- Make use of canopies, trees, and umbrellas outdoors for shade instead of using the clubhouse

COVID-19 CONFIRMED/SUSPECTED CASE RESPONSE ACTION PLAN

- Contact Public Health unit for guidance on what to do if someone develops symptoms at the club, or if you are told one of the club members has COVID-19; follow Public Health instructions
- Close the club while the affected area and equipment are disinfected
- Disinfect all surfaces that may have been touched by the ill person as soon as possible
- If Public Health contacts the club to advise that someone (a member or other person) who was at the club has tested
 positive, the call will be directed to the President of the club
- The club will follow Public Health direction and will share information (from the booking system) about people who
 entered the club to help Public Health with contact tracing, if needed
- The club will follow Public Health advice and will send a message to members that an infected person was at the club, making sure that the person confirmed to have COVID-19 is not identified to protect confidentiality
- A member who has recovered from COVID-19 will be allowed to come back to the club, as instructed by Toronto Public Health
- A member who was self-isolating because they were a close contact with the ill person will be allowed to come back to the club, as instructed by Toronto Public Health
